In 2017, Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester launched the **LIFT program** (**Lifting Individuals and Families Together**) thanks to the generosity of private funders, **Dora and Arthur Ullian**. The program implements elements of EMPath's model of Mobility Mentoring, with a goal of disrupting the cycle of poverty experienced by some of our community's most vulnerable families. Through meaningful coaching using tools and strategies, participating families create attainable action plans with individual and family goals that will enhance the standard of living for their family. Home visits, incentives and support are incorporated.

With that knowledge in hand, our practices at BGCD have evolved to include a deeper and more meaningful level of family engagement in our Early Education and Care programs. Parents have increased their role in the classrooms and are more knowledgeable about the curriculum, the philosophy and the strategy behind our approaches. These methods have recently been introduced into the general membership programs for school-age children and older youth, deepening the understanding amongst staff about the benefits of a multi-generational approach for families.

We strive to serve the family as a whole, believing that high quality early education and postsecondary education are essential to approaches that move the whole family toward economic stability.



A 2019 Babson College graduate, Pooja founded eternalHealth to deliver high quality, affordable care to her fellow Massachusetts residents. Committed to doing things the right way, eternalHealth is built on trust, transparency, and integrity. Pooja has been working tirelessly to be make healthcare accessible for all, while also acting as an advocate and educator for her members. Driven to make eternalHealth a catalyst for change in the health insurance industry, Pooja is not scared to tackle what some might call impossible. Ika states, "Nothing is impossible. With the right team and the thought process, anything is possible. I wake up every morning, grateful to have the opportunity to do what I love and be an advocate for our members."

Pooja has brought together a diverse and passionate team that are committed to making a difference. Her commitment to diversity and inclusion can be seen at all levels of the organization starting with the team and going all the way up to the Board of Directors and Investors. In addition to fostering a diverse work environment, she is committed to having 50% of the entire organization be woman.

Lisa received both a 2014 Columbia DuPont Award as well as a 2013 George Foster Peabody Award as part of WBZ-TV's team coverage of the Boston Marathon Bombings. Lisa has also received Emmy Awards for Anchoring in 2014, for On-Camera Talent Reporter in 2008 and for Hard News Story in 1996. In 2016, Lisa received the Circle of Giving Award at Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester's New England Women's Leadership Awards.

Lisa is passionate about empowering young people in Greater Boston and serves, with pride, on the Board of Directors of Big Sister Boston. She also serves on the Board of Directors of First Literacy, the Board of Overseers for Boston Ballet and a new Development Board at Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital. The daughter of two English teachers, Lisa often partners with the Mayor's Office for ReadBoston events. She works with Boston Children's Hospital on fundraising events, patient profiles and stories about research and treatment. She has also participated in events for Perkins School for the Blind, Horizons for Homeless Children, Disabled American Veterans and Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester. Every August, Lisa rides the Pan Mass Challenge to raise money for Dana Farber Cancer Institute and enjoys sharing stories of riders and doctors through WBZ's media partnership with the PMC.

People have called me a tenacious young woman with a strong will for perseverance despite my challenges. After years of rejection for employment and always being told I was not a good fit, I decided to not give up and start my own company so I could earn a living and live independently. I now have two companies and have turned my desire and dedication to empowering and employing other people facing challenges like I did. My cookie company has 15 employees and I ship all over the US and Canada!

My non-profit focuses on mentoring others and workshops for independence and entrepreneurship which I just love doing. I have found my whole heart filled with joy in advocating and empowering others! And I am just getting started! I have published my first book and am getting my second book published this year. I decided to write a series of books about my life and experiences each at different ages, hoping to inspire and help others through my challenges that I turned into triumphs.

My dream is to become a well-known national brand (like Tate's and Mrs. Fields), to have my own Ben and Jerry's Ice Cream, and to continue creating jobs for people with disabilities and lower their unemployment rate, which is a crisis for people like me. 82% of people with disabilities that are very able and wanting employment so desperately and to be a valuable entity to a company are being rejected.

I am all about family and inclusion and love telling my story to help motivate others to not give up and create a world where we all see abilities in each other! I am so excited to announce that I have a reality show airing on Peacock and Crave Keep called "Born For Business!"
