Before joining CBS, Lisa worked as a reporter and anchor at KIRO-TV in Seattle, Washington, KBCI-TV in Boise, Idaho and for KCBY-TV in Coos Bay, Oregon.

Lisa received both a 2014 Columbia DuPont Award as well as a 2013 George Foster Peabody Award as part of WBZ-TV's team coverage of the Boston Marathon Bombings. Lisa has also received Emmy Awards for Anchoring in 2014, for On-Camera Talent Reporter in 2008 and for Hard News Story in 1996. In 2016, Lisa received the Circle of Giving Award at Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester's New England Women's Leadership Awards.

Lisa is passionate about empowering young people in Greater Boston and serves, with pride, on the Board of Directors of Big Sister Boston. She also serves on the Board of Directors of First Literacy, the Board of Overseers for Boston Ballet and a new Development Board at Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital. The daughter of two English teachers, Lisa often partners with the Mayor's Office for ReadBoston events. She works with Boston Children's Hospital on fundraising events, patient profiles and stories about research and treatment. She has also participated in events for Perkins School for the Blind, Horizons for Homeless Children, Disabled American Veterans and Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester. Every August, Lisa rides the Pan Mass Challenge to raise money for Dana Farber Cancer Institute and enjoys sharing stories of riders and doctors through WBZ's media partnership with the PMC.

### Cara Belvin

Founder & CEO, Empower

Founder Cara Belvin was nine years old when her mother Kit died of breast cancer. Cara founded Empower (formerly empowerHER®) in 2013 out of the gratitude she had for all the layers of support her family received. Empower was formed around her dining room table as a grassroots movement and word quickly spread about her work. Thousands of inquiries came in from people who wished for an organization like Empower when they were growing up. Today, Empower is an international nonprofit with thousands of volunteers from across the globe.

Cara works with these Ambassadors to bring Empower's lifechanging programs to more children and young adults affected by parent loss.

Cara holds a B.S. in Psychology from the University of Connecticut and an M.S. in Psychology from Texas A&M University. She began her career as a School Psychologist working with children with disabilities before transitioning her career into nonprofit management and fundraising. Cara frequently speaks on issues surrounding adversity, women's empowerment, and social entrepreneurship.

Cara's efforts have been featured on CNN, The Today Show, ABC, PBS NewsHour with Judy Woodruff, and more. Cara lives in Scituate, Massachusetts with her husband and two children and travels the globe spreading awareness for Empower.



### **Allison Feaster**

VP of Team Operations & Organizational Growth, Boston Celtics

Allison Feaster is Vice President of Team Operations & Organizational Growth for the Boston Celtics. She is a former professional basketball player, a global citizen, and a trailblazer in the sports industry who is highly regarded for her leadership and teambuilding skills.

During her decorated college basketball career, Feaster was the first player in any sport to be honored as Ivy League Player of the Year three times, leading the first-ever NCAA Division-I Tournament upset of No. 16 seed Harvard against No. 1 seed Stanford. She was a first-round WNBA draft pick and went on to a 17-year professional playing career in the US, Spain, France, Italy, and Portugal.

Following her retirement from playing in 2016, Feaster joined the NBA's Basketball Operations Management Development Program. After serving as the lead of Player Personnel & Coach Relations for the NBA G-League, she joined the Boston Celtics organization where she currently leads Team Operations & Organizational Growth.

Beyond the court, Feaster serves on the NCAA's Board of Governors, and she is co-lead for Boston Celtics United, the Celtics' social justice initiative to impact social and racial inequities in Black and Brown communities in Greater Boston. She maintains her role as an active public speaker, a champion of the advancement of women and girls, and serves as a global advocate for sport, including serving as a Sports Envoy for the US Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

Feaster is a graduate of Harvard College (BA, Economics) and the Universidad Europea (MBA).



### **Huong Vu**

Family Engagement Specialist, Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester

Huong Vu is a family engagement counselor at Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester, which is one way of saying she does a little bit of everything. With BGCD, Huong offers free play groups, a parent support group, family engagement events, home visits and developmental screenings for families with young children. She primarily works with families all over Boston who are low income or immigrants, and/or where English is not their first language. It's this work that makes her a great participant in Strategy for Children's Advocacy Network, a year-long advocacy experience for early educators and emerging leaders.

She says, "Every day, when it comes to work, my hope is that I can make small changes in families' lives. Maybe I can connect them to a food program, or I can refer a child to an intervention program." The Advocacy Network makes Huong think that she can go further than her daily role, that she can bring big changes into families' lives. One of her goals is to do more public speaking, offering public testimony at public meetings, including Boston school committee meetings. Vu also plans to offer one-on-one advocacy training to a group of parents, so that they can increase their advocacy work. "I hope that together, we can make our voices heard," she says about the need for more bilingual resources in the school system.

Huong's long-term advocacy goal is to make sure that parents and families are at the center of policy decisions. She says, "Parents should never question whether their voices are being heard or whether their vote counts."

Huong's efforts have been featured on WBZ Change Makers, Eye on Early Childhood, WBZ 4 Your Community, Early Learning Nation, and more.
