### Annissa Essaibi George

*Partnership Advisor,*  
Big Brothers Big Sisters of Eastern Mass

Annissa Essaibi George, 51, a mom, former high school teacher, business owner, first-generation American, and lifelong Boston resident, was elected as a Boston City Councilor At-Large in 2015 and ran for Mayor in 2021. She is also the owner of Stitch House, Dorchester's yarn shop and place to learn knitting, crochet, quilting and sewing.

As the first BPS teacher elected to the City Council and the first to serve as Chair of the Education Committee, Annissa's unique experience as a former teacher for 13 years at East Boston High School, and mother of four who attended the Boston Public Schools, fostered an inclusive environment for teachers, parents, and students. She led the Council's efforts to address their concerns through hearings on securing a full time nurse and a full time social worker in every school, improving school safety measures, increasing investments for vocational education, and increasing funding for our schools in the City's budget.

When taking office in 2016, Annissa served as the founding member and Chair of the Committee on Homelessness, Mental Health, and Recovery. Building from her education work, Annissa successfully increased funding in the City's budget to support the almost 5,000 students in BPS experiencing homelessness and helped launch a Family Led Stability Pilot to house those students close to their schools, winning her the 2018 Navigator Award for her innovative approach to government. To best inform policy, Annissa hosted monthly roundtable series that alternate between family shelter providers and mental health providers to connect them with policy-makers in government. Her most recent efforts to expand access to treatment includes filing an Ordinance Establishing A Mental Health Commission and an Ordinance Requiring Pharmacy Take Back for Sharps. In 2019, Annissa passed a City Ordinance forming a Special Commission to End Family Homelessness in Boston. In 2021 she ran for Mayor of Boston.

She recently served as CEO & President of the Big Sister Association of Greater Boston and now is the Partnership Advisor for Big Brothers Big Sisters of Eastern Massachusetts. Annissa is a mom to 4 great boys, 20-year-old Douglas and 18-year-old triplets Charlie, Kayden and Samir. Annissa and her husband Doug are both life-long residents of Dorchester.

Annissa, her brother Kareem, her sisters Sonia and Sarrah, and her children are all proud former members of Boys & Girls Club of Dorchester.

Emmy Award-winning journalist Lisa Hughes is a news anchor for WBZ-TV News weekdays at 5PM, 6PM and 11PM. Lisa joined the station in June 2000 and since then she has covered just about every major news event and newsmaker in New England. Before joining CBS, Lisa worked as a reporter and anchor at KIRO-TV in Seattle, Washington, KBCI-TV in Boise, Idaho and for KCBY-TV in Coos Bay, Oregon.

Lisa received both a 2014 Columbia DuPont Award as well as a 2013 George Foster Peabody Award as part of WBZ-TV's team coverage of the Boston Marathon Bombings. Lisa has also received Emmy Awards for Anchoring in 2014, for On-Camera Talent Reporter in 2008 and for Hard News Story in 1996. In 2016, Lisa received the Circle of Giving Award at Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester's New England Women's Leadership Awards.

Lisa is passionate about empowering young people in Greater Boston and serves, with pride, on the Board of Directors of Big Sister Boston. She also serves on the Board of Directors of First Literacy, the Board of Overseers for Boston Ballet and a new Development Board at Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital. The daughter of two English teachers, Lisa often partners with the Mayor's Office for ReadBoston events. She works with Boston Children's Hospital on fundraising events, patient profiles and stories about research and treatment. She has also participated in events for Perkins School for the Blind, Horizons for Homeless Children, Disabled American Veterans and Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester. Every August, Lisa rides the Pan Mass Challenge to raise money for Dana Farber Cancer Institute and enjoys sharing stories of riders and doctors through WBZ's media partnership with the PMC.

Born in Boulder, Colorado and raised in Moscow, Idaho, Lisa graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Journalism from the University of Washington. She and her husband, Mike, are proudest of their daughter, Riley, and son, Dylan.

Founder of Pretty N' Secure*

Harmoni Turner is an exciting young talent selected in the 2025 WNBA Draft. A senior at Harvard University, Harmoni will graduate in May 2025 with a degree in African American Studies, balancing her academic excellence with her athletic achievements.

At Harvard, Harmoni made history by leading the Crimson to the NCAA March Madness Tournament for the first time in nearly 20 years. Her all-around game, including her scoring, playmaking, and defensive skills, helped elevate her team to new heights and firmly established her as one of the top players in the NCAA.

In addition to her collegiate achievements, Harmoni was a standout on Team USA's 3x3 women's basketball team during the 2024 Olympics, where she played a key role in leading the team to victory and winning the Gold Medal. Her success in the fast-paced 3x3 format highlights her adaptability and competitive drive, qualities that will serve her well as she transitions to the WNBA.

Off the court, Harmoni is deeply committed to empowering young women through her nonprofit organization, *Pretty N' Secure*, which focuses on building self-confidence and providing mentorship for girls. The program operates under a 501(c)(3) charity and is dedicated to offering resources and support to help young women thrive.

As she finishes her senior year at Harvard, Harmoni is preparing to take the next step in her basketball career, where she will bring her leadership, skill, and determination.

**THE FIELDHOUSE**

**LET'S BUILD IT TOGETHER.**



Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester (BGCD) and the Martin Richard Foundation (MRF) have joined forces and are building partnerships throughout our City to reshape youth development programming in Dorchester and beyond. Our vision for this neighborhood, one of Boston's most diverse and under-resourced neighborhoods, holds the potential to generate lifetime benefits for Dorchester's children, their families, and greater Boston.

Our young people need a place to call their own, a safe place where all kids and teens are welcome to express themselves openly and freely, be with their friends and connect with role models and mentors who truly care about their well-being. This incredible state-of-the-art, 75,000 square foot facility will be an accessible and flexible youth development hub. Inside will host a full complement of BGCD programs and an array of services designed to support every aspect of youth development and family engagement. The space will include athletic facilities, a space for Theatre Arts, a Music Studio, a Teaching Kitchen, and an outdoor and community space, all intentionally designed with the input and vision from our Youth and Community.

On April 17th, The FieldHouse+ project broke ground at 315 Mt. Vernon St. in Harbor Point. It was a dream come true for so many who want to help the next generation find a place to call their own.

"This is the work we can feel good about," Bob Scannell, President & CEO of Boys & Girls Clubs of Dorchester, says. "Kids are the ones who will lead us to a brighter future."

"The Fieldhouse was born of necessity, of parents that wanted better for their kids," Bill Richard, Founder & Director of the Martin Richard Foundation says. "The need was there, but it just took someone crazy to say, 'Let's go for it.'"

Without our supporters' belief in our work to bring a state-of-the-art recreation and enrichment facility to Dorchester, none of this would be possible. Your support will have a lasting impact on generations of families from Dorchester, Boston and beyond. We are thrilled to be moving forward with construction and The FieldHouse+ is set to open in late 2026.


